
DEFINING PREVENTION

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WHAT IS SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER PREVENTION?

Substance Use Disorder Prevention focuses on strategies to prevent all levels of substance use.

SPECTRUM OF USE



LEVELS OF SUBSTANCE USE

 Ingestion of alcohol and Use other drugs without negative consequences • When use causes negative Misuse consequences for the individual using and those around them Continued use of alcohol or Abuse drugs despite the negative consequences
 "Compulsive" use of alcohol and drugs Addiction regardless of the consequences

- Increase alertness, attention and energy
- Stimulate dopamine and norepinephrine receptors




STEROIDS



A NETWORK OF CROSS-SYSTEM COLLABORATION




SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

SAMHSA is a department under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).

SAMHSA's mission is to "reduce the impact of substance misuse and mental illness on America's communities."

SAMHSA administers the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant to each State (SABG).



CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES (DHCS)





CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS (CFR) 45 PART 96

Defines primary prevention services for the purposes of distribution of federal block grant funds.

"Primary Prevention Programs are those directed at individuals who have not been determined to require treatment for substance abuse. Such programs are aimed at educating and counseling individuals on such abuse and providing for activities to reduce the risk of such abuse."




